1 GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 SYSTEM DESCRIPTION

The AGM Rattler TC35-384 is a compact thermal imaging clip-on system that allows quick transformation of the day optics into thermal imaging device without any special skills. Rattler TC35-384 can be easily attaching on up to 8x magnification scopes for medium range use and 24 hours operation under any weather and environmental conditions.

Powered with two CR123A or rechargeable RCR123A batteries the AGM Rattler TC35-384 gives up to 4.5 hours of continues work. An external 5 V power bank (battery pack) can be easily connected via an USB-C connector for a significant increase of operating time. Onboard Wi-Fi module for live video streaming and video/images recording via application are also available.




FIGURE 1-1. MAIN PARTS AND COMPONENTS

2 OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1. BASIC OPERATIONS

2.1.1 UNPACKING

The following steps must be completed prior to each mission.

- Open the carrying case, remove the device, and verify that all components are included.
- 2. Inspect the device for any obvious evidence of damage to the optical surfaces, body, operation buttons, etc. Ensure that all optical surfaces are clean and ready for use. Clean all optical surfaces with a lens tissue.

2.1.2 BATTERIES INSTALLATION

CAUTION:

Verify that the equipment is OFF before remove the batteries.




FIGURE 2-1, BATTERY INSTALLATION

To install the batteries (refer to Figure 2-1):

- 1. Turn the battery cover knob (A) counterclockwise and then open the battery cover (B).
- Install two CR123A or RCR123A batteries (C) into the battery compartment. Align the polarity symbols on the batteries with the polarity symbols on the device body (D).
- 3. Close the battery cover. Turn the battery cover knob clockwise until stop.

When the device is on a battery charge level is displayed on the status bar.

2.1.3 SELECT BATTERY TYPE

You can change the battery type according to your need. Select the correct battery voltage in the device menu.

- 1. In the view mode, hold **\equiv** button to show the menu.
- 2. Select +- Battery Voltage menu item, and press button to switch the voltage.

2.1.4 CONNECTING THE DEVICE

- 1. Open the cable interface cover.
- 2. Connect the device and power adapter with a Type-C cable to power on the device. Alternatively, connect the device and PC to files.




FIGURE 2-2. CABLE INTERFACE

2.1.5 CONTROL BUTTONS




FIGURE 2-2. CONTROL BUTTONS

The Rattler controls are shown in Figure 2-2 and are defined in Table 2-2.

Each button is responsible for some functions selected by short press or long press the button. Pushing a button for 3+ second is considered "long press/hold."

2.1.6 POWER ON AND OFF

Power On

Hold the POWER button 1 for 4 seconds to power on the device. An image will appear on the display.

Refer to the figure below for the main view of the clip-on display.




FIGURE 2-3. THE DISPLAY MAIN VIEW

Power Off

When the device is turned on, hold 1 button for 4 seconds to power off the device.

2.1.7 SLEEP MODE

In the view mode, press the 1 button. After a few seconds, the display will turn off. Press the 1 button again to exit the Sleep Mode.

2.1.8 PALETTE SETTINGS

You can select different palettes to display the same scene in different effects. Press **M** button in the view mode to switch palettes.

RED HOT	The hot part is red-colored in view. The higher the temperature is, the redder the color is.

2.1.9 DIGITAL ZOOM

Press $\cancel{D\pm}$ button in the view mode, the live view will switch between 1×, 2×, 4× and 8× digital zoom.

2.1.10 ON-SCREEN DISPLAY

Press button in the view mode to display or hide the OSD information.

When OSD (On-Screen Display) is on the information of Wi-Fi hotspot activation, digital zoom, storage memory status, and battery status displays in top right corner of viewfinder.

2.1.11 DISPLAY OF THE RETICLE

Hold $\cancel{D\pm}$ button in the view mode for 4 seconds, to display or hide the reticle. The crosshair helps you to aim at the target fast and accurately.

2.1.12 SHUTTER RELEASE

Press button in the view mode to release the shutter once for correction of the non-uniformity of display.

2.1.13 RECORD/CAPTURE

Video Recording

Hold <u>fo</u> button in the view mode and start recording. In the upper left corner, the recording time displays.

Hold button again to stop recording.

Snapshot Capturing

Press button in the view mode, to capture picture

NOTE:

- When capturing succeeds, the image freezes for 1 second and a prompt shows on the display.
- · For exporting captured pictures, refer to Export Files.

2.1.14 FILE EXPORT

- 1. Before connecting the thermal clip-on to a computer, please make sure that the Wi-Fi function of the clip-on is disabled.
- Connect the thermal clip-on to your PC with USB cable and open the detected disk.
- 3. Enter DCIM>100EZVIZ to view the videos and snapshots.
 - Select and copy the videos to PC and play the file with the player.
 - Select and copy the snapshots to PC and view the files.
- 4. Disconnect the device from your PC.

NOTE:

- The device displays images when you connect it to PC. But functions such as recording, capturing and hot spot are disabled.
- When you connect the device to PC for the first time, it installs the drive program automatically.

2.1.15 INSTALLING THE CLIP-ON ONTO THE LENS OF A DAY SCOPE

Use the day scope adapter (DSA) to install the Rattler TC onto day scope lenses.

ATTENTION:

The day scope adapter are not recommended for installing the Rattler TC on firearms with heavy dynamic recoil (0.308 Win or stronger).

NOTE:

The Rattler TC cannot be attached to scopes that include focus rings on the housing of the objective lens.

NOTE:

The adapter must fit with the day scope front lens diameter. The adapter fits objective lenses between 50-59 mm in diameter.




FIGURE 2-5. CLIP-ON INSTALLATION

Install the Rattler TC on the lens of a day scope as follows (refer to Figure 2-5):

- Screw the day scope adapter (A) onto the Rattler's attachment place thread (B).
- 2. Turn the lever (C) backwards to loosen the adapter clamping device.
- 3. Place the insert into the DSA's clamp.
- Slide the Rattler TC with the DSA onto the lens of the day scope as far as it goes.
- 5. Turn the nut (D) CW/CCW respectively for adapter's size adjustment.
- 6. Affix the DSA to the day scope by locking the lever (C). Verify that the clip-on is firmly secured to the day scope. If necessary, readjust the clamping device by turning the nut (D).

2.1.16 THERMAL VIEW OBSERVATION

- 1. Install the Rattler TC on the weapon with a day scope (refer to part 2.1.15). Verify that the Rattler TC is securely mounted.
- 2. Remove the protective caps.
- 3. Point the equipment at an object.
- 4. Activate the Rattler TC. After approximately 4 sec, video of the thermal scene should appear.
- If the day scope includes a focusing ring (i.e., parallax adjustment knob), adjust the focus for a parallax-free image.
- 6. Turn on the day scope's reticle illumination and adjust the reticle brightness.
- 7. Adjust the focus of Rattler TC by turning the focus ring.
- 8. Using the buttons on the control panel, configure the Rattler TC for your specific situation. Set palette, brightness, contrast, scene mode and FFC (Flat Field Correction), to display the best image effect.

For more information on operational setting procedures, see Part 2.2 (Main Functions).

2.1.17 EYEPIECE REPLACEMENT

The device can be used as a clip-on scope or a handheld observational camera. You can replace the eyepiece to realize different use of the device.




FIGURE 2-6. EYEPIECE REPLACEMENT

- 1. Rotate the fixing ring (Figure 2-6, A) of clip-on output lens (B) anticlockwise to remove it.
- 2. Align the optional monocular eyepiece (C) with the grooves (D) of device, and rotate the fixing ring of eyepiece (E) clockwise to tighten it.

2.2 MAIN FUNCTIONS

2.2.1 MENU OPERATION

When the device powers on, hold **b** button in the view mode for 4 seconds to display the menu.

Press and D± buttons to move between menu items. The active element is highlighted in orange. Press button to select menu item or change an option.

Hold button to exit the menu.




FIGURE 2-7. MAIN MENU

2.2.2 BATTERY TYPE

You can change the battery type according to your need. Select the correct battery voltage in the device menu.

- 1. Hold ibutton in the view mode to show the menu.
- 2. Select 🖅 Battery Voltage menu item, and press 🔠 button to switch the battery voltage.

2.2.3 BRIGHTNESS ADJUSTMENT

- 1. Hold **button** to show the menu.
- 2. Select D Brightness menu item and press button to adjust the brightness.

In White Hot mode, you can select one of five levels of the brightness to adjust the image lighter or darker.

In Black Hot mode, the brightness of the image turns in the opposite way.

2.2.4 CONTRAST ADJUSTMENT

- 1. Hold button to go to the menu.
- 2. Select ① Contrast menu item and press 🔚 button to adjust the image contrast. You can select one of five levels of the contrast.

2.2.5 SCENE MODE

You can select proper Scene Mode according to environment temperature to improve the display effect.

- 1. Hold button to show the menu.
- 2. Select ◆ / ▲ Scene Mode menu item (◆ is default option) and press \= button to switch scene.
 - Recognition mode () improves an image so that the object edge is more distinct.
 - Jungle mode (<u>)</u>) is more suitable for hunting environment because of the highlight function of small objects.
- 3. Hold for 4 seconds to save settings and exit.

2.2.6 NETWORK CONFIGURATION

Connect your phone to the Wi-Fi hotspot of the clip-on, you can configure the parameters and realize functions of the device.

- 1. Hold button to show the menu.
- 2. Select nmenu item to enable Wi-Fi hotspot function.
- 3. Turn on the WLAN and connect to the Wi-Fi hotspot.
 - Hotspot Name: Wlan-IPTS Serial No.
 - Hotspot Password: Last 9 digits of Serial No.
- 4. Search the client software on App Store (iOS System) or Google Play[™] (Android System) to download and install the app. T-Vision APP is recommend.
- 5. Open the APP and connect your phone with the device. You can view the interface of clip-on on your phone.

NOTE:

When the power is less than 15%, the Wi-Fi hotspot function will be turned off automatically.

2.2.7 PICTURE IN PICTURE MODE

- 1. Hold button to show the menu.
- 2. Select PIP menu item and enter PIP mode. The details show in the upper left corner.

NOTE:

When Boresighting is enabled, the PIP view is the detail of crosshair.

When Boresighting is not enabled, the PIP view is the detail of central part.

3. Press == button to switch the PIP type. Upper Left, Upper Middle, Upper Right, and OFF are selectable.

NOTE:

When you select Upper Right as PIP type, the OSD will be blocked.

4. Hold button to exit.

If digital zoom is enabled, the PIP view also zooms. If the digital zoom ratio exceeds 4, the PIP does not zoom.

2.2.8 BORESIGHTING

All Rattler TC are adjusted on the laboratory test equipment with accuracy aligned to 1 MOA or better. The final accuracy depends on customer riflescope, parallax of used rifle scope and shooting distance.

To achieve better result accuracy, use electronic accuracy correction. Adjust the position of the clip-on reticle so that it coincides with the center of the day riflescope reticle.

- 1. Turn on the reticle display by pressing and holding $\mathcal{D}\pm$ button.
- 2. Hold button to show the menu.

- 3. Select [+] Boresighting menu item. A crosshair shows in the center of the view.
- 4. Press M or D buttons to select one of 5 reticle type. Then press button to confirm.
- 5. Press M, , , and , buttons to move the crosshair position. The coordinate shows the current position of the crosshair.
- 6. Hold button to save and exit.

2.2.9 RETICLE COLOR

You can change the color of the crosshairs.

Enable reticle first.

- 1. Hold button to show the menu.
- 2. Select [C] Color menu item and press \equiv button to switch the color of crosshair. White, Green, and Red colors are selectable.
- 3. Hold button to save and exit.

2.2.10 TRAJECTORY CORRECTING

Enable the trajectory correction to shot the target with high accuracy by marking the offset between the big crosshair and small crosshair.

Select the desired reticle type in the Boresighting menu.

- 1. Hold button to show the menu.
- 2. Select ► Trajectory menu item. Two crosshairs show in the view. The big one is reticle crosshair, and the small one is trajectory correction crosshair.
- 3. Set the distance.
 - 1). Press $\stackrel{\textstyle \longleftarrow}{=}$ button, and then press $\stackrel{\textstyle \frown}{\bigcirc}$ or $\stackrel{\textstyle \bigcirc}{\cancel{D^\pm}}$ buttons to adjust the distance between the target and the device.
 - 2). Press button to save the distance settings.
- 4. Set the crosshair position of trajectory correction.
 - 1) Aim the big crosshair at the target.
 - 2) Shot and mark the actual drop point of the bullet.
 - 3) Press M, , , o and , b buttons to move the small cursor to the position of the actual drop point. You can view the coordinate of the cursor in the view.
- 5. Press button to switch to the next distance.






FIGURE 2-9. TRAJECTORY CORRECTING

6. Repeat step 3 to 4 to set another trajectory correction position.

You can save up to five corrections for different distances. Corrective aiming points will be displayed with short lines on the reticle.

7. Hold button to exit.

2.2.11 FLAT FIELD CORRECTION

Flat Field Correction (FFC) function can correct non-uniformity of display.

- 1. Hold button to show the menu.
- 2. Select (+) FFC menu item and press = button to switch the FFC mode.

 $\label{lem:hatto} \textbf{Auto:} \ \ \text{The clip-on performs FFC automatically when switching on or rebooting the camera.}$

Manual: Hold button in live view to correct the non-uniformity of display.

External: Cover the lens cap, then hold D button in live view to correct the non-uniformity of display.

3. Hold button to confirm the setting and exit.

2.2.12 DISTANCE MEASUREMENT

The device can detect the distance between the target and the observation position.

NOTE:

When measuring the distance, keep the hand and the position steady. Otherwise, the accuracy may be affected.

- 1. Hold button to show the menu.
- 2. Select menu item and press button to enter the Distance Measurement mode.
- 3. Press $\cancel{\cancel{D}\pm}$ button to go to the target setting interface.
 - 1) Press \bigcirc or \bigcirc to select the target from Wolf (0.8m), Bear (3.0m), Deer (1.2m), and Custom (1.8m). Each target preset can be modified from 0.1 to 9.9m.
 - 2) Set the target and press 🔚 button to confirm.
- 4. Align the center of top mark with the edge of target top. Press 📃 button.

The cursor blinks on the top edge of the target.

5. Align the center of bottom mark with the edge of target bottom. Press 📃.

The left top of the image displays the distance measurement result and the height of the target.

NOTE:

Go to distance measurement interface, and press \equiv button to view the result of the previous measuring target.

2.2.13 HOT TRACKING

The device can detect the highest temperature spot in the scene and mark it on display.

- 1. Hold button to show the menu.
- 2. Select \(\int \) / \(\cdot \) and press \(\overline{\overline{\text{im}}} \) button to enable/disable hot spot mark (marking the spot of highest temperature).

When the hot spot mark is enabled, the -'- mark displays in the spot of the highest temperature. When the scene changes, the -'- mark moves.

2.2.14 DEFECTIVE PIXELS CORRECTION

Defective Pixels Correction (DPC) function can correct the defective pixels on the screen which are not performed as expected.

Before you start switch the palette to White Hot mode.

- 1. Hold ibutton to show the menu.
- 2. Select D DPC menu item and press button.
- 3. Press M, \mathbb{Z} , \mathbb{Z} and \mathbb{Z}^{\pm} buttons to move the cursor to the position of dead pixel.
- 6. Hold button to correct the dead pixel.

2.2.15 CVBS OUTPUT

You can view the video on CVBS monitor, to get a better and clear image, more convenient to check the detail.

 Connect the USB-CVBS cable to USB port of thermal clip-on and to monitor's CVBS port.

NOTE:

USB-CVBS cable need to be purchase separately.

NOTE:

CVBS Output function doesn't support hot plug, so please connect the cable before power on.

- 2. Hold button to show the menu.
- 3. Select **CVBS** menu item and press **button to turn on or turn off the CVBS** video output.

2.2.16 LANGUAGE SETTING

2.3 CLIENT SOFTWARE INTRODUCTION

We recommend using T-Vision (V5.4.12 and below) software. Install the client software on your mobile phone first, and then connect your phone to the hotspot of the clip-on. Refer to chapter 2.2.6 for details of hotspot connection.

NOTE:

The device password is set by user at first activation. If the password was lost or forgotten, it can be reset. To make a reset, provide the following action:

- 1. When the clip-on is turned on, hold 🔚 button to activate the OSD menu.
- Select menu item and press button to restore all parameters to default settings.
- 1. Open the APP and connect the phone or pad with the device.
- 2. If the device is inactivated, set the password and activate it. If the device is activated, enter the password to add it to app.
- 3. When the device is added, the live view can be seen. You can view the interface of the clip-on on the software. User can change such image parameters as brightness, contrast, zoom, palettes directly via phone or pad as well as record video on phone/pad memory.




FIGURE 2-11. CLIENT SOFTWARE

3 MAINTENANCE

3.1 MAINTENANCE

3.1.1 CLEANING PROCEDURES

- 1. Gently brush off any dirt from the body of the device using a clean, soft cloth.
- 2. Moisten the cloth with fresh water and gently wipe down the external surfaces (except lenses).
- 3. Dry any wet surfaces (except lenses) using another dry, clean, soft cloth.
- 4. Using a lens brush, carefully remove all loose dirt from the lenses.
- 5. Dampen a cotton swab with ethanol and slowly, gently wipe down the lenses. Clean the glass surfaces using circular movements, starting from the center of the lens and moving out towards the edge, without touching the lens holder. Change the cotton swab after each circular stroke. Repeat this step until the glass surfaces are clean.
- Clean the accessories with a soft brush (or cloth) dampened with soap and water.

3.1.2 PREPARING FOR EXTENDED STORAGE

CAUTION:

Thoroughly dry each item before placing them into the storage case.

To prepare the clip-on for extended storage:

- 1. Clean the clip-on and accessories.
- 2. Place all items into the storage case.

3.1.3 VIEW DEVICE INFORMATION

- 1. Hold button to show the menu of device.
- 2. Select Version menu item and press button. You can view the device information such as version, and serial No.

3.1.4 UPGRADE DEVICE

Please get the upgrade package first.

- 1. Connect the device to your PC with USB cable.
- Open the detected disk, copy the upgrade file and paste it to the root directory of the device.
- 3. Disconnect the device from your PC.
- Reboot the device.

The device upgrades automatically. The upgrading process will be displayed in the main interface.

3.1.5 RESTORE DEVICE

- 1. Hold button to show the menu of device.
- 2. Select Restore menu item and press button to restore the device to defaults according to the prompt.
